
American Legion Baseball

Post Connections

In this issue we feature Geo Johnson QM2SS. In his own words!

In 1967 with the draft a possibility because of my poor college grades, I made a trip to the US NAVY RECRUITER. I had wanted to go into the Navy when I was younger after talking to two of my uncles who were sailors. "JOIN THE NAVY SEE THE WORLD INTRIQUED ME". I signed my enlistment papers with the recruiter in May of 1967. On June 15, 1967 I got my draft notice to report on July 9. I was inducted and sent to NAVY boot camp July 7. Just before I went into the Navy a friend who was on leave told me I didn't want to be on a destroyer but If I wanted better food and an easy job and more money to volunteer for Submarines and be a QUARTERMASTER. At NAVY boot camp in San Diego, CA I volunteered for Subs and QM school. I was accepted and went to Sub School and QM school training for about 5 months and graduated near the top of my class.

I was then assigned to the USS SEADRAGON SSN 584, a nuke sub at Pearl Harbor Hawaii. Two months later I was assigned to the USS CARBONERO SS337, a WW II Diesel Sub and went to western Pacific for various classified missions including VIETNAM for 6 months. I was assigned to the SS337 for close to 3 years navigating the sub on various missions as a QM2 SS (E5), Submarine qualification requires extensive on board training to earn your "DOLPINS" learning all of the systems on board and to be able to fill in anywhere in an emergency.

In December 1970 I was on the Decommissioning Crew of SS337 and was then transferred to USS SARGO SSN 583, which was going into the yards. I was assigned to be the softball coach since QMs do not have much to do in port. I was discharged in June 1971. I got to see more of the world than I had dreamed of and some of what I was not supposed to see. I went to San Diego, CA, New London, CT, Boston, MA, NYC, New York, Honolulu, HA, Yokosuka and Tokyo Japan, Bangkok Thailand, Saigon Vietnam, Subic Bay and Manila Philippines, Adak AK, Victoria BC. and places the government would disavow our actual existence if we were ever captured. It was all quite an adventure and I would do it again! I only wish I would have stayed for 20 years.

About 30 legionnaires attended, and lunch was catered by Vista Linda - parmesan baked chicken, baked potatoes, green beans, and green salad with apple cobbler for dessert. The morning session was busy with numerous state officers presenting information of interest to our members, like NEC reminding us to not wear a legion hat or logo if in an interview or political add - as we, as Legion members are non-political. 

Lee also presented an updated "Five Year Maintenance Plan" at the September 28 Post Membership Meeting. (Re: Plan in this newsletter) Our post building is old and in much need of repair!

Five Year Maintenance Plan with Estimated Costs (9/28/20)

First, our estimated building/grounds normal maintenance budget will remain at \$500 per year. This takes care of lawn and snow removal. This budget will also address immediate needed repairs on our water, heat, and cooling systems that we now have in place. It will also be used for fixing or repairing deferred maintenance on the building. Part of this budget may be used for cosmetic purposes, such as painting kitchen, basement floor and other small items. Should be we not use our entire budget, the remaining balance will go into a fund to be used on our 5-year maintenance plan; however, the present year budget will not be used just for the sake of exhausting this year's operating budget. Presently, the deferred maintenance on this building would cost much more than we can afford or budget for. So, we will take this one bite at a time to one step at a time.

<u>2020-2021</u> – Put up ceiling fans we have had for 6 years. Estimated costs should not exceed \$75.00 for electrical wiring. Need work detail – date and time.

<u>2020-2021 – Repair and replace rain gutter and down spouts. – Estimated cost - \$300.</u>

<u>2020-2021</u> - Scrape and paint windows, front door frame, basement door and frame. Need 2 more gallons of paint. Estimated cost - \$200.

<u>2020/2021</u> – Replace, repair, and repaint fascia and door frame on front of building. Get contractor bid for final cost. Our estimated cost was \$650 in 2017.

2020-2021 – Rebuild handicap ramp and repaint. Estimated cost - \$1,800

TOTAL ESTIMATED COST FOR 2021 - \$2,925.00

<u>2021-2022</u> - Repaint interior and exterior of building, both upstairs and down (to include basement floor.) Estimated costs - \$800.

<u>2021-2022</u> – Frame in toilet upstairs and install door - \$550.

2021-2022 – Clean upstairs carpet professionally and stairs. Estimated cost - \$250.

TOTAL ESTIMATED COST FOR 2022 - \$1,600.00

<u>2022/2023</u> - Lengthen steps into basement on southside of Legion Hall. Put in a minimum of 7 steps. Modify outdoor entrance cover and move existing door to the new entrance, covering new steps. Remove existing concrete steps. Dig out to the south of building, probably 3 to 5 feet to afford more reasonable slant of steps. Estimated costs - \$4,500. Need fund raiser.

TOTAL ESTIMATED COST FOR 2023 - \$4,500.00

<u>2023/2024</u> – Replace basement heating system with energy efficient system. Estimated cost - \$3,500. Need fund raiser.

TOTAL ESTIMATED COST FOR 2024 - \$3,500.00

<u>2024-2025 - Repaint lower level to include kitchen and basement floor. Need a paint detail. Material cost - \$400.</u>

Repair and replace rain gutter on building. Estimated cost - \$500.00

TOTAL ESTIMATED COST FOR 2025 - \$900.00


